Denial of Reinstatement

The Background:

Facts: Respondent was a part of the Praxis exam cheating scandal in Memphis, Tennessee. Respondent paid someone to take the Praxis exam for him. His license was revoked in 2013.

Status: Respondent was notified by certified mail of the Board's intent to deny his application for restoration of his educator license based upon these findings, and of his right to a hearing. The certified letter was returned unclaimed. The United States Postal Service notation that a properly addressed certified letter is "unclaimed" is sufficient legal notice to the addressee. Additionally, Respondent was notified by electronic mail on two separate occasions of the Board's intent to deny his application for restoration of his license. Respondent received the notice, but did not request a hearing.

The Recommendation:

Respondent's conduct constitutes grounds for license revocation pursuant to Emergency Rule 0520-02-03-.09(3)(d), (g), (4)(c)(7)-8).

The Board staff recommends denial of Respondent's application for restoration of his Tennessee educator license.
